Description:

This course provides an analysis of the theories, research findings and instructional practices in foreign and second language learning, with practical illustrations in the areas of French as a second language. Students will learn how language-teaching methods have evolved since the 1960s. Different teaching approaches (behaviorist, audio-visual, communicative, cognitive, etc.) will be examined with reference to theoretical issues and historical background. Special emphasis will be placed on the teaching of specific skills (reading, writing, listening, speaking) and culture, and on the roles of the teacher and the learner in the classroom.

- 4. **Development of a Lesson Plan (take-home assignment).** Each student will prepare a two page lesson plan which will be due on March 18, 2010. Your lesson plan should include:
 - Audience and context (the learner)
 - Content to be presented
 - Learning objectives for the participants
 - Evaluation and Assessment techniques
 - Class activities
 - Resources and materials
 - Room arrangement and equipment needs
